Central North American Racing Association (CNARA) was formed by a group of Racers as well as Race Promoters to sanction oval snowmobile races.

The most important part of the organization is the establishment of uniform racing and safety rules for both the driver and the spectator alike.

Rules are important for the drivers so that when a racer travels from Eagle River, Wisconcin or Valcourt, Quebec and comes to a race in Beausejour, Manitoba the rules and regulations are the same as his home racing association.


The safety concern means the racer knows, in traveling, he can be assured that all the latest safety rules and race track improvements are adhered to.

To do this, CNARA belongs to an organization called ISR, International Snowmobile Racing. This is a United States

based group who make up the race rules and safety rules with input from members from different racing associations. CNARA being included. ISR also acts as a center organization for gathering all current machine specifications and makes them available to members of associations.

On a race weekend, CNARA will be responsible for the running of the race which includes getting the insurance and meeting with the track builders to ensure that they maintain track safety standards to both the racer and the spectator. Technical people are provided to inspect participating sleds to ensure rules are adhered to.

This is just a brief outline of what a sanctioning body is responsible for. Now, sit back and enjoy some of the best racing that the volunteers from Beausejour can provide. Remember, it takes not just the racers to put on a good race but also you, the spectator.

ICE OVAL RACE DECEMBER 5, 1993

C.P.T.C. Inc. hosted a hastily called ice oval race on December 5th, 1993. No race was planned because USSA had a race sanctioned in Bessemer, Michigan on that date. However, C.P.T.C. officials received a lot of phone calls from both local and USSA racers urging them to put on a race that date because they felt weather conditions wouldn't allow Bessemer to build a track.

In a few short days C.P.T.C. directors and volunteers built an excellent race track and after some hasty promotion the race was on.

Racers from as far away as Quebec and Idaho were in attendance and fans were treated to great racing in 13 different classes. The following are the race results.

RESULTS

After hosting this race C.P.T.C. felt that the season's opener should become an annual event in Beausejour. With proper promotion it can become a major race in the snowbelt. Next year's date will be December 4th, 1994. Plan to be in attendance to see all the new racing equipment for 1995.

C.P.T.C. also plans to run more CNARA sanctioned races throughout the year to give local racers more incentive to stay involved in snowmobile racing. The season finale will be the 33rd Annual Canadian Power Toboggan Championships on March 4th and 5th, 1995.



International Year of the Family - 1994

BEAUSEJOUR'S 33rd ANNUAL WINTER FAREWELL FESTIVAL

Beginning in the early 1960's and continuing today, Beausejour's Winter Farewell Festival has provided local residents and visitors from across the continent with a week or two of fun and frivolity just before the snow melts and the snowmobiles hibernate.

THE PRESENT

Many of the local establishments provide special evening entertainment in the form of "Chili Cook-Offs", "Perogie Eating Contests" and their own versions of T.V. game shows. Several cabarets and the ever-popular "Night to Remember" are like "Old Home Week" with former residents and the racers renewing old aquaintances and enjoying themselves.

Family oriented activities are also an important part of our Festival. This year saw the grouping of several old and new events in a "Family Fun Day" where indoor and outdoor competitions were interspersed with music by local entertainers and many displays and demonstrations.

Many long-time favorites such as the "Smoosh Races" (five people on one pair of skiis) and a "Horseshoe Tourney" in the snow, met up with newer events such as the "Agassiz Chainsaw Classic" (log cutting competition) and the fierce pride of the locals at the "Sausage Judging". A newcomer this year that attracted a lot of attention was a "Chainsaw Chucking Contest".

A LITTLE ABOUT THE PAST

In its earliest days the Festival had a rustic, northern flavour to it, with dignitaries and citizens often wearing Winter Farewell touques.

In 1965 there was a "Flour Packing" competition with the contestants carrying loads in the range of 350 lbs. on their backs. That year also saw a visit from festival queens from York Factory, Flin Flon and other northern towns.

1969's opening ceremonies for the Canadian Power Toboggan Championships featured parachutists and a fly-over by

jets from CFB Gimli. Excitement was provided by the "Polaris Thrill Team" as they crashed through a wall of flame and leaped rows of cars on their snowmobiles.

In 1973 a "Moonlight Tobog-A-Thon" along the Brokenhead River drew over 70 snowmachines.

WHAT GOES AROUND COMES AROUND

Every festival has its parade and Beausejour is no exception. In the mid 1960's there were large daytime parades with dozens of power toboggans (remember, there was a Polaris factory here) and many conventional floats.

By the 1970's this had evolved into a night time "Torchlight Parade" of snowmobiles which continued until the early 90's. 1993 saw the return of the Saturday morning parade and it is on the way to becoming a major event again.

SOMETHING FOR EVERYONE

From the exotic events like the "Snowmobile Tossing" and "Kennel Queen" competitions to the more conventional "Family Fun Skate" and outdoor "Youth Ball Hockey Tournament", there is plenty to keep people busy in late February and early March every year.

The Festival also has a mascot now. "Chilly Willy" is a life-sized snowman who attends many of the activities in person, much to the delight of young and old.

WHY IT CONTINUES AFTER 33 YEARS


A part of the monies raised at various Winter Farewell events each year is returned to the community in the form of donations to charities and local community-oriented organizations.



Many events took place throughout the 1993 season which included: three races, two freestyle demos, many meetings, countless outings and rides, production of a quarterly newspaper called the Jet Journal and a Windup Social where top racers received trophies and a beach theme had all members racing boats in a kiddie pool!

A possible race at Grand Beach may take place in August. CIRCUIT

In what could arguably be the toughest cross country race in recent years, the Can-Am Racing Circuit staged the inaugural Beausejour 300 this weekend in Beausejour, Manitoba.

Consisting of rivers, ditches and tight, twisting bush trails, this race gave drivers exactly what they have been craving all year long — a true cross country race. "This race will separate the guys who are fast from the guys who think they're fast," one top racer mentioned Friday afternoon.

Day 1 saw racers pull up to the line and start one at a time, at 30-second intervals. Once they completed a 50-mile lap, 35 of which were trails, they re-entered Beausejour's Ice Oval Complex to run through a sno cross course that led them to their fuel stops. Once refueled, they set off to complete another circuit. Lap times were hovering in the 1-hour range for much of the day.

During the course of the day, several racers were unceremoniously dumped from their mounts as the terrain started to get pounded out. Paul Mack won style points for the day as he was launched at least 20 feet in the air. Don Jorstad, ISOC's regular commentator put the situation into better perspective: "Mack was high enough in the air he could have been shingling a roof!"

Mack recovered from his spill and, at the end of the day, posted a time of 3:04:27, which tied him with Kevin Spielman for First.

Day 2 saw the Pro 500 field start in reverse order of the previous day. Following them were the rest of the Stock classes, which were only going to run two laps on a course even more rugged than the day before.

With First Place still up for grabs to at least a half-dozen racers, they tore into the course with reckless abandon. Now was not the time for prudence and lap times backed up that fact as some lap times actually improved from Day 1. The most notable was the ride being put together by Greg Rugland. Starting the day nearly 5 minutes behind the leaders, Rugland showed why he could very well be one of the best terrain racers for years to come. Not only did he win, but he finished an incredulous 3:52 in front of a hard-charging Paul Mack. "I knew I had a lot of ground to make up and I thrive on this type of course, so I just kept her taped," stated Rugland shortly after finishing. Finishing Third, 1 second behind Mack, was Jim Theriault from the Can-




