



Racing Classes

RACES BY CLASS THAT YOU WILL SEE THIS WEEKEND

CHAMP 440: The sleds in this class are limited to single track design and 440 cc engines. Arctic Cat, Polaris and Ski Doo all run sleds in this class. Although the sleds appear reasonably stock, they are anything but. A whole host of chassis and engine modifications are allowed in this class.

PRO SPRINT 1, 2 & 3: The common denominators in the 3 Pro-Sprint classes are the sleds must be single track chassis and they all must have functionally silenced exhaust with only one pipe per engine. The difference between the classes are differences in carb size and how an engine size is arrived at, whether it be by sleeving up or down.

MODIFIED 500: Only single track snowmobiles can compete in this class. The engines are limited in size to 500 cc and must originate from a stock production snowmobile. Carb size is also limited based on the number of cylinders.

STOCK CLASSES: Beausejour runs 5 stock classes. They are as follows:

Stock 600	600 max.	OEM			
Stock 500	500 max.	38 mm	OEM single		
Stock 440L	440 max.	34 mm	OEM single		
Stock 440F	440 max.	34 mm	OEM single		

PRO STOCK: Has the same sled requirements as Stock 440L. The difference is that racers who run in Champ440canruninProStockbutthey cannot run in the regular stock classes.

EARLY MODEL: This class is for 1975 and older stock production snowmobiles. Engine and chassis modifications are allowed. This class has a lot of local racer participation and always provides great racing.

LATE MODEL: This class consists of sleds that are 1982 or older and have leaf spring suspensions. The engines must be air cooled and all components must be basically stock.

RELIC ONE: The sleds in this class are 1970 and older. The chassis must originate from a stock production sled. Modifications are allowed to most components and clutches can be changed in the interest of safety. This is a great class for taking snowmobile race enthusiasts on a trip down memory lane.

A big Beausejour welcome to all the racers, fans and out-of-town visitors! We know your stay in our community will be exciting and enjoyable.

To all organizers, volunteers and sponsors, thank you for your tremendous efforts in making Beausejour the "Power Toboggan Capital of Canada".

Museum Begginings

A snowmobile museum is our area has been long overdue, since this area is rich in history which should be preserved for future generations.

The first power toboggan was built in Brokenhead in 1947 by Mike Bosak. The first power toboggan race was held in March of 1963 in Beausejour. Beausejour is also known for having the only Polaris factory in Canada during the 1960s and early 1970s.

As a board member of the Broken-Beau Historical Society for the past 25 years, one of my main interests was to have a display of snowmobiles and related memorabilia. Because of lack of proper space, this couldn't be accommodated in the existing museum facility. A separate building would be necessary, therefore this would become a separate venture.

Museums and private collectors in Canada and the U.S. are picking up pieces of our history. For this reason, we should make an effort to retain the history in this area.

In an open letter to one of our local papers in March of 1999, Historical Society President Peter Kozyra stated the need for outside interest to help in getting this project off the ground.

I chose to spearhead this project because of my personal interests. Mike Bosak, who built the first power toboggan, was my father. Also, my husband Paul helped build

these machines and now my son Bob is restoring antique snowmobiles.

As a result of the newspaper article, we had our first meeting in May of 1999. We have an excellent group of board members to get this project off the ground. People like William Kozyra from Beausejour and Gord Emberley of Lac du Bonnet gave us a start in the right direction by offering some words of advice and motivation.

The rest of the history, we will be working on.



Operators are placing themselves in grave danger due to the many hidden dangers along the right of ways.

Operators of snowmobiles/atv's observed trespassing on railway property may face a charge under the railway safety act for trespassing or a trespass offence under the Provincial Act. The penalties can be severe, the worse case is being seriously injured or killed. The Police Service aggressively participate in promoting safety, but will if necessary charge individuals who violate the law.

The Ice Maker

Although it is billed as "The Greatest Show On Snow", the Canadian Power Toboggan Championships continue to be a success on an internationally respected ice oval due to the tireless efforts of local volunteers.

Long time Beausejour resident George Towle is one of those people who knows both sides of that scenario as he is the main ice maker for the CPTC Raceplex and does so with no hint of remuneration.

"I do it to help out, it's fun and I enjoy giving back to the community," Towle said during a break inside the CPTC offices.

Since the CPTC began making ice to race on, a number of individuals have come forward and driven the tanker around the track. Towle, 68, said he was approached by the executive about becoming the main icemaker four year ago. Being retired and with a knowledge of heavy machinery, he took on the challenge and hasn't looked back ... except, of course, to see if the tanker is frozen up.

Towle says that doing a good job while wrestling with Mother Nature is a formidable task. He and his fellow workers have been out on some pleasant days, but those are not best suited for making ice. For this job, the colder the better and the wind can sometimes cause a problem.

"We have never quit because of cold temperatures, and when it's windy, you can't stop," Towle said pointing out that even taking a coffee break is ill advised as the wind chill can drop temperatures as low as -40 degrees C. "Things almost freeze up instantly. And once you've frozen up on the track, it makes for a long day."

Towle says that warm weather is

the biggest obstacle as witnessed at least year's events. The track eventually wore down to a point where water and slush were pushed to the centre of the raceway with graders and the earth underneath the track was exposed in some spots.

This year, the executive made a concerted effort to stay ahead of the game. Towle says that for the CPTC races on March 3 and 4, he began to pour water on the track in mid-November. Working some days from 7:30 a.m. to 8:00 p.m., Towle says it takes 17 minutes to fill the tanker and approximately 45 minutes to make one round of the track and dump the capacity 6,000 gallons of water. In a decent day, Towle says he can sometimes make 15 trips and dump an approximate 90,000 gallons of water.

"After eight or nine loads I begin to lose track," Towle laughed.

The half-mile oval is 80 feet wide on the straight-aways and 100 feet on the corners. Along with ice made in the staging a pit areas, Towle estimates that 2.8 million gallons of water have already been spilt leaving eight or nine inches of ice in the flats and 14 inches on the turns.

"This year, we are way ahead of the game," Towle said. "Once the ice is made, we can all sit back and relax."

CPTC president Richard Kuffner says that Towle has become an integral part of race preparations over the past number of years and without him and the other members who work on creating the track, there would be no races to speak of.

"George's work has been tremendous," Kuffner said. "He doesn't mind working days or evenings and has given his time freely. He has been a very good asset to the CPTC."

Kuffner added that Towle has a

great deal of dedication to his work. Last year, he apparently slipped on the track and took a tremendous jolt. The fall left him black and blue and earned him a trip to the hospital for some stitches on his head.

"They just stitched him up and he was back on the track," Kuffner stated, "He perseveres."

Kuffner says that making ice sounds simple enough to someone who doesn't do it, adding that one would think the process simply involves dumping water and moving on. He says that if you talk to anyone who makes ice like at a curling rink or hockey rink, there are tricks involved in making good ice.

"Any volunteer that we get is obviously a valued volunteer. However we don't have many volunteers that have taken the initiative like George," Kuffner laughed. "It has become his baby and we are certainly thankful of that."
