

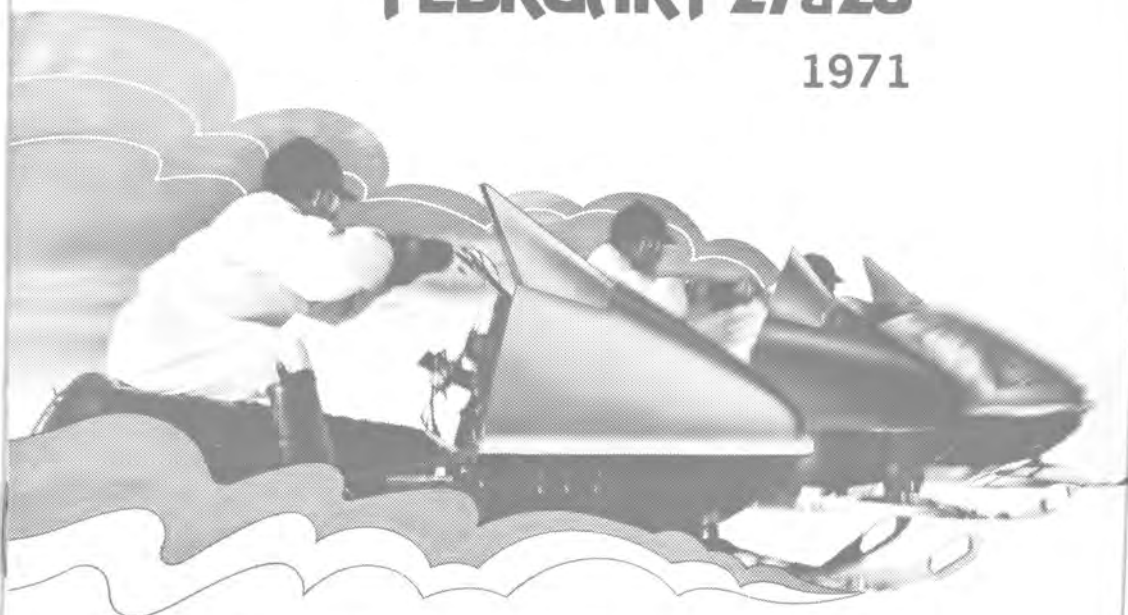

Welcome Race Fans

1971 will mark Beausejour's ninth annual Canadian Power Toboggan Championship races.

It all began in the fall of 1962, under the guidance of Ron Kinney and leadership of Eyfi Walterson, President of the Beausejour Lions Club.

In February, 1963, the first Canadian Championship was run with 15 drivers competing. As this sport gained momentum, the event outgrew the Lions Club and has since become a community project. Entries have also grown, from the original 15 in 1963 to 210 in 1970.

To keep our lead in Canadian power toboggan racing, we have offered more classes and, with these, more prize money. We have increased cash prizes from \$5,000 in 1970 to \$25,000 this year. The 1971 race meet has been sanctioned by the Manitoba Snowmobile Association.

The racing committee extends a warm welcome to all visitors at this climax of our 1971 Winter Farewell. We trust you are reached by the excitement of the Canadian Championship.

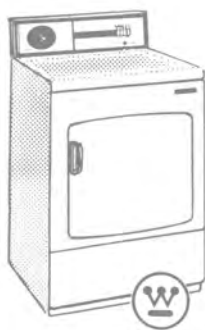


Larry Mauws of Portage la Prairie accepts the Canadian Championship trophy from 1970 C.P.T.C. President Murray Shuster.

Canadian 800

Larry Mauws

Larry Mauws of Portage la Prairie won the 1970 Canadian Championship with a Ski-Doo Blizzard. He finished the five-mile race in a record time of 6 minutes, 52 seconds. He also placed second in the Canadian 440. He has won 800 and 440 classes in Manitoba Snowmobile Racing Association sanctioned events and the Western Championship in the 440 class. He plans to defend his Canadian title in Beausejour in 1971.

Canadian Ladies 440 and 340

Connie Lucko

Connie Lucko of Beausejour had won three Canadian Championships before she was 17 years old. In 1970 she guided Ski-Doo Blizzards to Canadian Ladies 440 and 340 titles and placed third in the Canadian Ladies 295. In 1969 she won the Canadian Ladies 347 class. This year she has been called to drive for the Bombardier factory. She will defend her Canadian titles in Beausejour.



Canadian Jump

Alan Fanset

Alan Fanset's 1970 victory in the Canadian Jump class followed his Canadian Championship win in 1969. It was the second time he had taken the jump title. He also won the Timmy Hetteen Canadian Junior trophy in 1967. Alan was Manitoba champion in 1970. Now in his sixth year of racing, the Charleswood Arctic Cat driver is 19 years old.
